252 Seniors To Graduate At NCR Auditorium Wednesday

"The Future Is Present" is the theme for Wilbur Wright's 24th annual commencement exercises at the National Cash Register auditorium, Wednesday, at 8 p.m. 252 seniors will be graduated at the exercises.

Kaye Sims will present the invocation for the program. In keeping with the theme of "The Future Is Present," Alfred Dabrowski will speak on "The Future." Nancy Raacke will speak on "The Future." "The Past" will be Warren Russell's topic. Calvin Vice will conclude the theme presentation

by speaking on "The Perfect Future."

Senior Class President, Gerald Wise will present the class. Accepting the class will be Robert French, superintendent of the Dayton Public Schools. Dr. Theodore Light, from the Dayton Board of Education, will grant the diplomas to the 252 graduating seniors. Donna Kear will close the program offering the benediction.

Ceremonies To Be Held At Westminster; "On Being A Person" Chosen As Theme

Wilbur Wright will hold its Baccalaureate services at Westminster Presbyterian Church, Sunday, at 6 p.m.

The theme for this year's service, held traditionally on the Sunday before graduation, is "On Being a Person."

Although these gifts need not be kept sacred, they should be treated with high regard, for it took many a senior weeks of nerve-racking contemplation to think of what they wished to will.

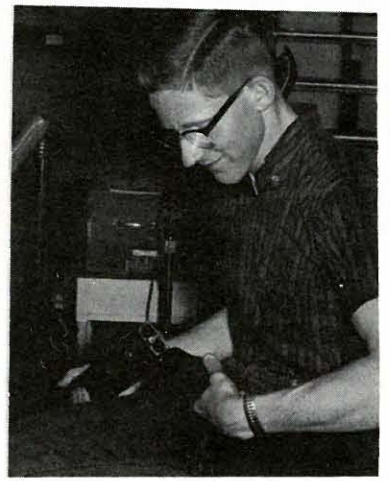
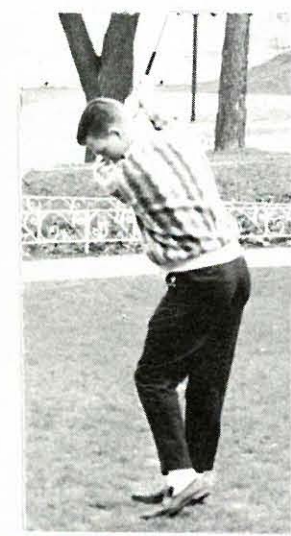
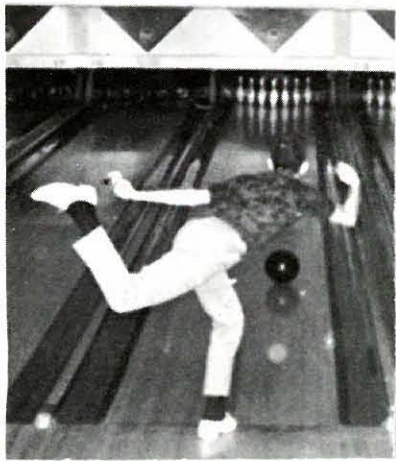

Although most school activities have come to a close, spring sports are still continuing at a fast pace.

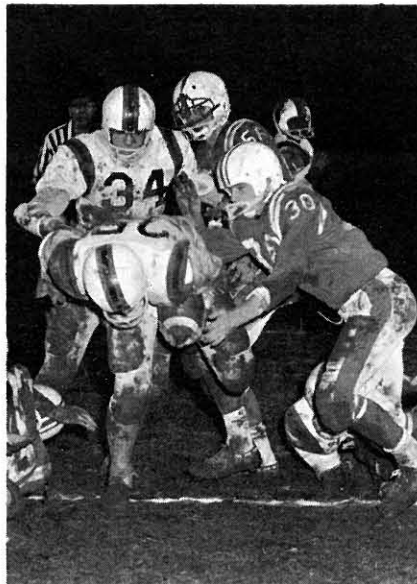
